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The following words contain:

lip sounds (m, b, p)

tongue sounds (t, d, n)

all vowel sounds

These sounds are expected to be mastered by 90% of 3-year-olds. The following is a list of words/pictures for children to practice. The words are “Vowel-Consonant” (i.e., up) words which are typically harder than “C-V” words, but easier than “Consonant-Vowel-Consonant” (i.e., bus) words which come later.

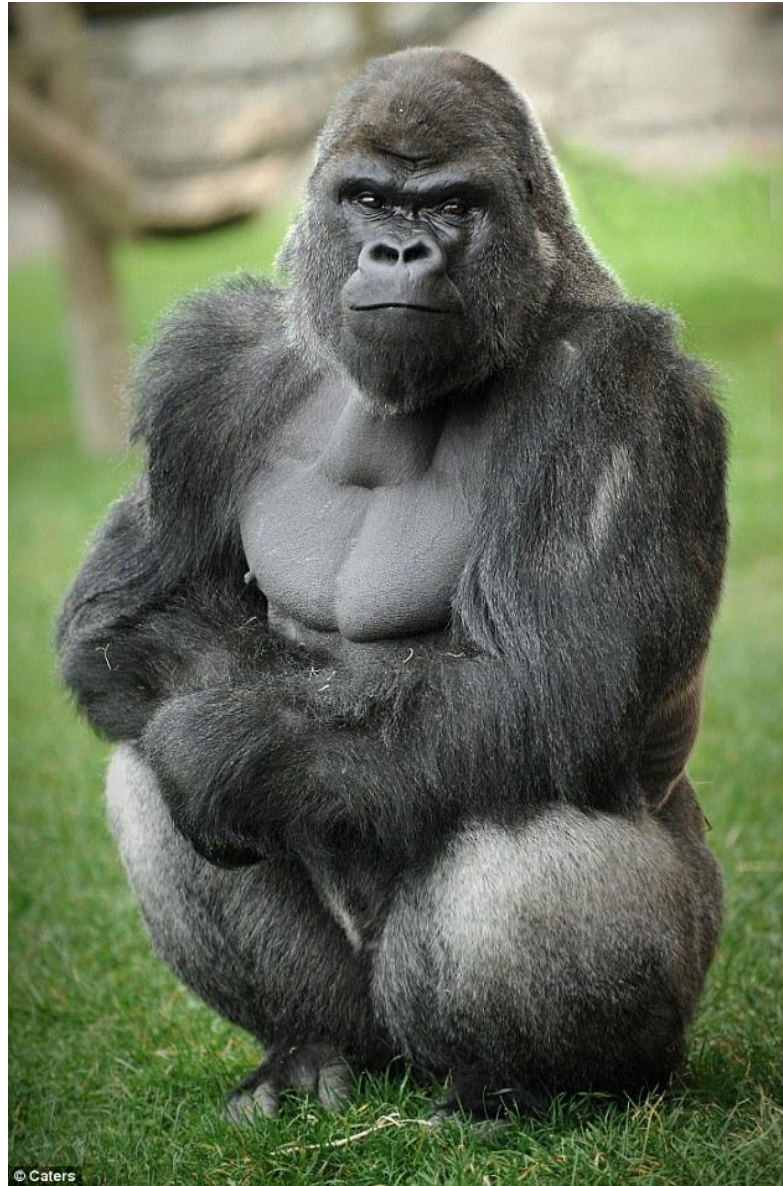

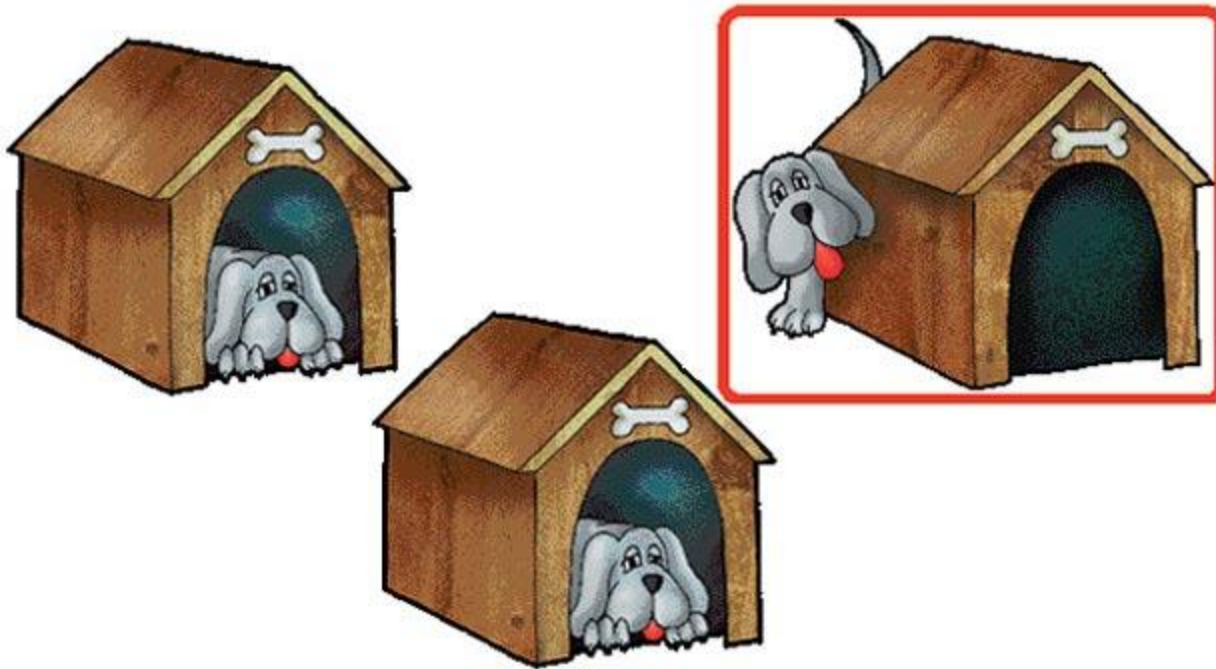
